BARMER: A government medical officer in Batadu village of Barmer district has shifted his outpatient services to a tent as

outpatient services to a tent as part of a protest against the administration's inaction against persistent encroechments. The move, he says, is aimed at drawing attention to a problem that has stalled key facilities and inconvenienced patients. Dr. Jogendra Choudhary, the medical officer in charge, said he had submitted at least ten complaints to the sub-divisional magistrate and tehsildar, and even met the district collector several times, but no action followed.

"Due to lack of staff quarters, employees are unwilling to stay here, night services are suffer-

ing, and patients are facing prob-lems daily. To draw attention, I am now running the OPD in a tent," he said.

The protest is underway at the

ommunity health centre (CHC)
in Batadu, where alleged illegal
occupation has blocked construction of the boundary wall and staff quarters, with sanc-tioned funds eventually lapsing and patients also denied access

to a planned free medicine shop under government schemes. It is alleged that 10-12 shops have been built lilegally on the hospital land, leaving the premises ecoposed to stray cattle and dogs. Plantation drives have also failed, contributing to the hospital failed, contributing to the hospital residence, or the strain of the hospital and Laslaya scheme where missing infrastructure has led to point deductions. JAIPUR: Over 700 private hospitals in Rajasthan, associated with the Rajasthan Govern-ment Health Scheme (RGHS) have announced the suspen-sion of cashless services from August 25, citing severe finan-cial strain due to delayed pay-ments and budgetary con-straints

raints. In a memorandum to chief In a memorandum to chief minister Bhajan Lal Sharma, the Rajasthan Alliance of Hospital Associations (RAHA)—which includes IMA, PHNHS, Upchar, AHPI, and JMA—said that despite continuous discussions with officials since April 1, 2025, no concrete solution has been reached.

The alliance, representing more than 1.1 lakh healthcare

workers and their families, 10,000 vendors, 4,200 pharma-cists, and 4,000 doctors, said

10,000 vendors, 4,200 pharma-cists, and 4,000 doctors, said that repeated delays, unclear deductions, and limited bud-deductions, and limited bud-the private healthcare system into deep crisis.

"Despite our efforts, we are left with no option but to us-pend RGHS cashless services from August 25; the associa-tion said, while expressing inconvenience government employees, pensioners, legisla-tors, journalists, and their fam-lies who rely on the scheme. The hospitals have urged the state government to take urgent steps for a permanent ensure the scheme's sustaina-bility and to safeguard its real beneficiaries.
