Subject:- Grant of conditional permission to the Mahatma Jyotiba Fule Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, Sikar Road Harota, Chomu, Jaipur-303702, Rajasthan (AYU0321) for intake capacity of 100 seats of UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22 under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

- 1. The GOI, Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP(1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session 2021-22 and the permission for the academic year 2021-22 of the ASU &S colleges was considered on the basis of part-I visitation proforma submitted by the college on the condition that the college shall submit an undertaking & indemnity bond, stating that they shall fulfill respective requirements in terms of required teaching and training facilities specified in the relevant regulations throughout the academic year".
- 2. Further, during scrutiny of the notarized affidavit of teachers submitted by the college to Medical Assessment and Rating Board for academic year 2021-22, it came to the notice of the authority that the teacher namely Dr Yerrangu Prasad and Dr Jasmine Kazi was Practicing during College Hours At DYANIMIC UNIVERSE AYURVEDA HOSPITAL, KURNOOL, ANDHRA PRADESH AND AYUSH CLINIC, PUNE, MAHARASHTRA as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board an opportunity of virtual hearing was granted to your college and teachers on 22.12.2021 respectively.
- 3. Therefore in view of observation of hearing committee, in accordance with Section 28 (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 and decision taken by the NCISM in its 04th Meeting held on 23.08.2021 circulated to all colleges vide letter dated 31.08.2021, it was decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board to impose a penalty of Rs. 50 lakhs(Rupees 25 Lakh each teacher) on your institution, as the teachers DR YERRANGU Prasad and Dr Jasmine Kazi was proved to be physically absent but present only On Paper. Subsequently the said teacher was also not certified under Regulation 3 (i) (f) of MSR 2016 for the academic year 2021-22. In this regard a letter dated 11.01.2022 has been sent to you to remit the penalty amount worth Rs. 50 lakhs to this commission and it was also informed to you that permission for the session 2021-22 shall be withheld till the remittance of the penalty amount.
- 4. Further, your college filed an appeal before commission vide letter ref. no. 4268 dated 19.01.2022 against the order dated 11.01.2022. However, the said appeal was dismissed on 25.02.2022.
- Further, the MARB vide its letter ref no. 26-80/2021-Ay dated 12.10.2022 & 30.11.2022 sent reminder letter to your college to furnish penalty amount worth rupees 50 lakh in favour of National Commission fund for Indian system of Medicine.
- 6. That your college has submitted that penalty amount of Rs 50 Lakh through NEFT No. RATNH22346387646 dated 12.12.2022, hence, you have fulfilled the condition imposed as stated in letter dated 11.01.2022 that permission for the session 2021-22 shall be withheld till the remittance of the penalty amount.

- 7. Therefore, college has been assessed again on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the Ministry of AYUSH and on examining in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criteria for Granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course for A.Y. 2021-22 after deducting the 02 teacher who has been not certified by the commission.
  - 8. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine to Grant of Conditional Permission to The Principal, Mahatma Jyotiba Fule Ayurveda Mahavidyalaya, Sikar Road Harota, Chomu, Jaipur-303702, Rajasthan (AYU0321) for conducting 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22 subject to the following conditions:-

I. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college. II. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month

- explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
- 9. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats UG (BAMS) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 10. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 12. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by before opening of part-1, proforma to get permission for the session 2022-23:
  - I. All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
  - II. All the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
  - III. All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto;
- 13. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.
